Exhibit: H Pharmacy Services Open Enrollment No. HHS0014137 Guidance for Use of the Texas Department of State Health Services Pharmaceutical Contingency Contract

This guidance is to be used to provide out-patient prescription drug services to individuals who are impacted and/or evacuees of Hurricane Laura at the following pharmacies: Pharmacy 1 Pharmacy 2

This guidance applies to Texas and Louisiana evacuees in Texas.

This guidance is to be used by shelter managers and NOT to be used for hospital patients.

- 1. Pharmacy will use reasonable efforts to first verify whether each individual or Displaced Resident has another payor source such as Medicaid, Medicare, or other governmental program, or private insurance that will reimburse the pharmacy for the prescription prior to invoicing the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS).
- Individuals, Displaced Residents or Shelter Managers will present prescription(s) through written or faxed prescriptions(s) or other substantial written evidence, such as labeled pill bottle as allowed by law and/or emergency orders to the activated pharmacy. Pharmacy will accept prescription(s) or pill bottle from BCFS staff, Shelter staff, patient or from DSHS directly.
- 3. Individuals, Displaced Residents or Shelter Managers will present copies of state issued documentation, such as Driver's License, State issued ID card, Passport booklet, Military ID, Birth Certificate, State concealed handgun license, U.S. Citizenship Certificate or Certificate of Naturalization with photo to the activated pharmacy.
- 4. Pharmacy will verify prescription(s) and insurance or lack of insurance with the individual's pharmacy for approval to fill.
- 5. Pharmacy will dispense up to a 30-day supply for each prescription filled, unless dispensing considerations requires otherwise.
- 6. Pharmacy will not be obligated to dispense prescriptions for individuals who do not have substantial written evidence of their prescriptions.
