The RFA states that an anticipat"d \$1 million will be available annually for up to a total of \$4 million. However, the period of performance, as stated in Section 2.2.3, will only last one year from March 1, 2024, through August 31, 2025. Just to make sure that I understand correctly, is \$1 million annually for up to \$4 million the correct funding available for this RFA?	Sub Section 2.2.3, Period of Performance, B., states "DFPS anticipates that the initial term of any Grant Agreement resulting from this RFA shall be from date of execution through August 31, 2025. Following the initial term, HHSC, at its sole option, may extend any resulting Grant Agreement for one additional 12-month term to complete a new RFA or transition to a new Grantee." The value of the RFA includes the allowable 12-month extension and accounts for potential increases to available funds.

Will zip code 77026 still be an option as an expansion site?	No, the final approved ZIP Codes are all listed in the RFA Sub Section 2.2.1, Service Delivery Area (SDA), A. Table page 16.



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3.	RFA HHS0013413 2.2.1 A.Service Delivery Area (SDA) Table Page 16	I am [an employee] and I'm reaching out on behalf of [a nonprofit]. Our organization focuses on protecting children and strengthening families through child care and early education, primarily for low-income families in our community. Our [section] Director and I attended the training hosted some time ago on the CYD program and excitedly began planning how our organization might implement it. We were disappointed to see the announcement that the zip codes we serve are not included in those eligible to apply. Wichita Falls is considered a high-risk area for child maltreatment, with the zip codes 76306 and 76301 consistently ranking as "comparatively high" or "among the worst" zip codes in Texas. Violent crime rates have risen yearly since 2018, and according to the CDC, Wichita County was the worst in Texas for drug-related deaths several years ago. The nearest available CYD program is a roughly 3-hour drive for the youth in these zip codes. Is the list of zip codes eligible for the RFA released final, and if so, could you share how the list is created and what determines whether zip codes are eligible?	Refer to Sub Section 2.2.1, Service Delivery Area (SDA), A. Table Page 16 for eligible ZIP Codes. DFPS selected ZIP Code(s) based on data indicating the highest number of formal referrals to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department and without a current CYD investment.

Per Section 7.1 Expenditure Proposal, all proposed costs will be evaluated for reasonableness, allocability and allowability within the context of the program services, scope and budget. Applicants may propose leasing a vehicle; however, all individual proposals will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and rationale for including such costs should be included.

Question: Can we use existing YAC funded by current CYD program to help distribute CSNA for this RFA?	Per Section 8.2 Incurred Costs, the costs of developing Grant Applications, preparing for or participating in oral presentations and site visits, or any other similar expenses incurred by an Applicant are entirely the responsibility of the Applicant, and will not be reimbursed in any manner by the State of Texas. The Applicant can use an existing YAC to distribute the CSNA if using the YAC is programmatically justified. The Applicants can NOT bill any costs for distributing the CSNA to the current CYD grant.
