Does 2G mean that, if you have a current contract, you never need to be accredited? Or, does 2F still apply and Clubhouses must become accredited if they are not currently? If we are not currently accredited, can we provide a letter from Clubhouse International stating a clear timeline for accreditation, with their acknowledgement and support?
